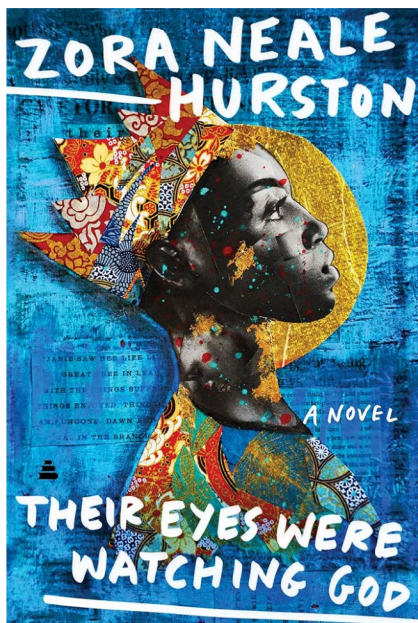
## 2026: THE BOOKS THAT SHAPE US

## Swords & Spice Romantasy Book Club – February Meeting February Selection: *The Lies of Lena* by Kylie Snow

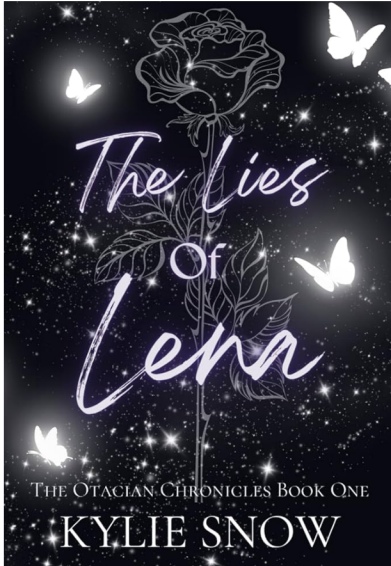

**Wild Birds of Pennsylvania Art Competition for Kids**

Welcome to the Seneca Rocks Audubon Society's "Wild Birds of Pennsylvania: Through The Eyes Of Youth" Art Competition for Kids. Please read the rules carefully before entering.

**Who Can Enter?**

The competition is open to children ages 4 to 18 who are residents of Clarion, or Forest counties or patrons of the Brookville Library. The art will be divided into three groups:

- Elementary grades Pre-K through 3rd
- 4th through 6th
- Jr. High/High School grades 7th through 12th.
- One entry per child

**Theme:**

"Wild Birds of Pennsylvania: Through The Eyes Of Youth." Create an artwork that depicts a wild bird that lives in Pennsylvania that you have seen or want to learn more about.

- All artwork must include 5 interesting facts about the bird depicted or created. Either submit the list of facts in the [Google Form](#) provided and attach it to the artwork, or incorporate the information into the artwork in some fashion.

**Artwork Guidelines:**

- Artworks can be a painting, drawing, sculpture, collage or mobile. No photos.
- Artwork can be created by using paint, crayons, markers, colored pencils, clay, wood, wire, paper, fiber, recycled products, or any mixed media.
- Size Restrictions:
  - Drawings or paintings must be no larger than the standard A3 (11.7 X 16.5 inches)
  - Sculptures must be self-standing and no larger than 12" X 16"
  - Mobiles must have their own support for displays and no larger than 24" X 32".
- Artwork must be original and **created by the child**. No help is allowed from adults except to supply materials or resources as needed, and deliver the artwork to the library. Kits, paint by numbers, and tracing, etc., are also not permitted.

**Important Dates:**

- Deadline to Submit: March 21
- Judging starts: March 25-31
- Winners announced: April 8th
- April Art show at Michelle's Cafe, in Clarion for the finalists.

- Submit your entry to your Community Librarian

- Attach the printed email to the back of the artwork that provides
  - Full name
  - Age/Grade
  - Title of Artwork

- 5 Interesting grade level appropriate facts about the bird
- Name of the Library
- Parent or Guardian's contact information

#### **Prizes**

- One winner from each age group at each Library will receive a bird themed prize and a certificate.
- Each winner will automatically be entered into the Grand Prize Competition with the eight other participating libraries in Clarion, Forest and Jefferson Counties.
- Three Grand Prizes: 2 General Admission Tickets to the National Aviary in Pittsburgh and a pair of Vortex binoculars for each winner of the age categories.

#### **Other Rules:**

- Entries must be picked up by the parent/guardian upon conclusion of the Art Show(s). No entries will otherwise be returned
- By entering, you give SRAS and the Library permission to display the artwork and share it on our website or social media
- Judges' decisions are final
